

In this study, coconut water as local source of hormones, and madre de cacao extract as local pesticide were used as growth enhancer and as pesticide. 





A total of forty LRIs all over the Philippines took part in organizing the Network.

Strengthening Local Governments in the Philippines

Why is there a need for this project?

The implementation of the LG Code of 1991 paved the way towards local autonomy and providing local government units with vast powers and resources needed for the development of their communities. Despite this significant development, after more than a decade of LG Code implementation, a lot of communities (26%) are still experiencing poverty. A large number of LGUs are still striving to reach their envisioned development and reducing poverty remains to be a formidable challenge to them. Strengthening local governments will definitely contribute in addressing this dilemma.

What is the Project all about?

The project will utilize capability building as the fundamental process to facilitate genuine local autonomy and enhancing the capacities of local government units to be effective economic and service units. It will focus on the areas of local financial management, revenue generation and local enterprise development to improve LGUs' management and administrative capabilities.

The project aims to:

- Enhance the capacity of LGA as enabler and service provider for the training needs of LGUs; and
- Enhance the capacities of LGUs in the areas of local finance, resource and revenue utilization, generation and management with cross-cutting themes on gender and development and environmental protection.

Specifically, to meet the overall aim, the following will have to be carried out:

- Capability building programs that will enable LGUs to create a business-friendly environment that fosters sustainable climate for financing and investment; and
- Professionalization of public duties which will support the implementation of capacity building courses and training interventions specialized in different subjects of local governance field.

Who are our development partners in this intervention?

The Spanish Government through the Spanish Agency for International Development Cooperation (AECID) will provided financial and technical assistance in this program. Local institutions such as DILG National and Field Offices, Local Government Units in the Regions of Bicol and CARAGA, Local Resource Institutions, Leagues of Local Governments and Other Development Partners from the ODA community will play a crucial role in ensuring the attainment of the goals of this program.

Where and for how long will it be implemented?

The project will be implemented in selected LGUs in Regions V and XIII. The project will be done in 3 phases until 2010. Bicol and CARAGA were pre-identified by the development partner since they are already implementing programs on agriculture, health and education in the said areas which are mainly funded and pioneered by the AECID. This program will reinforce the delivery and implementation of the existing AECID programs in Bicol and CARAGA by focusing on the governance aspect which is deemed as a crucial area that would ensure efficiency, accountability and efficacy in terms of translating outputs into development outcomes.

What are the potential benefits from this project?

- 1. Institutional capacity of LGA will be strengthened to deliver the necessary capacity building interventions;
- 2. Local planning mechanisms will be implemented to encourage participation of all the social groups,
- 3. Environmental protection and gender and development will be prioritized as cross-cutting issues in the program,

5. Institutional conditions of the beneficiary LGUs in financial management, public service

4. Communication systems in the beneficiary LGUs will be enhanced; and

How are we going to meet the intended results?

Initially, a Project Management Office (PMO), which will be assisted by a Spanish Program Director, is going to be established in LGA. In the course of implementation, a pool of multi-disciplinary local experts will be tapped to assist LGA and DILG in the implementation of this program.

The PMO will be responsible in the conduct of the following:

- 1. Training/ workshops for municipal authorities and civil servants;
- 2. Activities on citizens participation and gender equality;
- 3. Activities for the improvement of organizational, administrative and municipal planning systems;
- 4. Publications and technical assistance for the implementation of municipal communication and information systems; and
- 5. Strengthening of management capabilities for the improvement of municipal finances and joint revenue collection.
