Building a better world for children

World Vision Child Sponsorship provides funding for
long-term development that addresses the multifaceted
causes of poverty in sponsored children's communities.

Through child sponsorship, World Vision Malaysia funded
development in 14 projects across the world this year:

----- **food** | 9,538 parents were taught about nutrition
and farming skills. 156 babies received milk.

----- **water** | 180 water systems, 55 wells and 277 water
filters were installed. 1,500 students now have proper
toilets to use in school.

----- **education** | 428 children were able to continue
their education despite financial difficulties, 7,932
received school supplies, 577 teachers were trained,
and 2,299 students now study in refurbished schools.

----- **health care** | 10,058 villagers had medical check
ups and treatment, 1,279 expectant mothers received
maternal care, 7,978 villagers learnt about hygiene,
disease prevention and child health care.

----- **economic development** | 4,182 learnt about
entrepreneurship, 258 parents were assisted to
begin/improve their small businesses and 3,528 people
benefited from improved transport infrastructure.

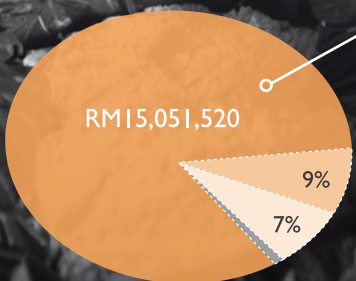

HIV/AIDS Hope Initiative

In 2008, World Vision Malaysia funded HIV/AIDS prevention education for 72,882 people across the globe.

In Malaysia, the World Vision HIV/AIDS Hope Fund garnered RM292,646, which was used to give care and support to locals living with HIV/AIDS (in partnership with local NGOs).
