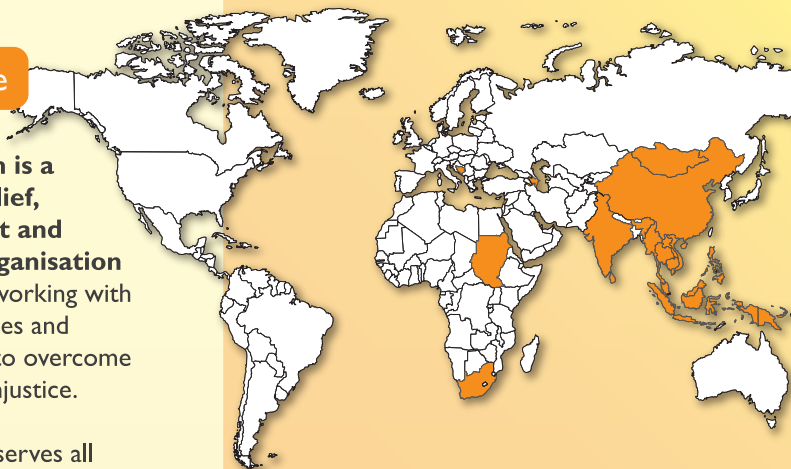

## In 2010...

### World Vision International

- worked in close to 100 countries
- benefited approximately 4 million children through the Child Sponsorship Programme

### World Vision Malaysia

- raised over RM24.5 million
- sponsored out 6,700 children through the Child Sponsorship Programme, bringing the total number of sponsored children to 40,020
- served the poor in 17 countries\* including Malaysia

## what we do: community development

**Through child sponsorship,** Malaysians contributed RM20,905,393 to give a hand up to children in need, ensuring that they and their communities have access to basic necessities such as:

- clean water
- improved nutrition
- basic health care
- education
- economic development

Children from the following 11 countries were supported by Malaysians through child sponsorship: Cambodia, China, India, Indonesia, Laos, Lebanon, Mongolia, Myanmar, South Africa, Thailand and Vietnam.



World Vision takes a holistic approach to child development. We strive to ensure that all children are healthy and educated, establish wholesome relationships and are participative, and most importantly, are cared for and protected. **87% of the funds received benefited children, families and communities in need. The breakdown is as follows:**

- 80% Development programmes for children and communities
- 3% Emergency relief
- 4% Local charities
- 8% Donor care and administration
- 5% Fund-raising and awareness

**RM758,801** was raised to help disaster-struck communities in the countries below to get back on their feet:

- **China** | Drought
- **Haiti** | Earthquake
- **India** | Floods
- **Indonesia** | Earthquake
- **Laos** | Typhoon
- **Vietnam** | Typhoon

*All funds given for the emergencies above have been utilised in the respective communities for their immediate and longer-term needs. However, our policy is that changes in circumstances beyond our control such as the political or security situation in a country could mean it is no longer possible to carry out our work. In such cases, funds will be channelled to assist communities in other life-threatening emergency situations.*

**Through the 30-Hour Famine**, over 14,500 Malaysians learnt about urban poverty and raised RM1,287,440 for children and communities in:

China, India, Lebanon, Malaysia, Myanmar, North Korea and Thailand.

*World Vision sees advocacy as an intrinsic component of its service to the poor. World Vision's advocacy programmes address issues in four main areas: children, gender, economics and conflicts. World Vision's core advocacy goal is to work towards a world that no longer tolerates poverty.*

**RM774,702** worth of gifts were purchased for children and families in Azerbaijan, Indonesia, Malaysia, Myanmar, Sudan and Vietnam. Gifts included cows, warm clothing and eye surgery kits.

HIV/AIDS hope fund



**RM209,043** was given to provide support for people living with HIV/AIDS in Thailand and Malaysia (in partnership with local NGOs).
